

Volunteer Role for 13 – 24 year olds Reading Hack



A Reading Hack Volunteer carries out any or all of the activities below, according to the volunteer's interests and skills as well as the needs of the library. These activities apply to Summer Reading Challenge, Duke of Edinburgh and Arts Award Volunteers.

What area are you interested in?	What activities can you help staff with?	What characteristics would you need to have?
Pre- school children	Story time sessions – read stories out aloud, encourage children to interact with the story, involve them in choosing stories and related craft tasks. Rhyme time sessions – hand out rhyme sheets, sing rhymes with associated actions, encourage involvement. Craft activity sessions – help children to create crafts	A Reading Hack Volunteer needs to be able to engage with and enthuse children and to show patience and tolerance when helping them.
Children; mainly of school age	Help children to create crafts or support them in discussing books . Help with preparing displays and setting up for the activity and with clearing up afterwards.	A Reading Hack Volunteer needs to be able to engage with and enthuse children and to show patience and tolerance when helping them.
Craft work and displays	Prepare craftwork for library craft activities and decorations . Help to make library displays .	A Reading Hack Volunteer needs to have some practical ability and be able to follow instructions for making craftwork.
Shelving and support	Shelve books , basic processing of books, tidy shelves, compile leaflet packs , help with displays and photocopying .	A Reading Hack Volunteer needs to be able to follow simple instructions about processes and to shelve accurately according to the library shelf sequences.
Promote activities for other teens	Help to plan and run reading and other activity sessions. Write reviews of the activities. Helping to promote volunteering to other teens.	A Reading Hack Volunteer needs to be able to communicate well with others.
Summer Reading Challenge	Activities can include any of the above but also includes promoting the Summer Reading Challenge in the library and helping participants sign up.	A Reading Hack Volunteer needs to be able to engage with and enthuse children and to show patience and tolerance when helping them.
Create your own!	Do you / group of volunteers have an idea for a project, session or just a great idea? This could be in coding, theatre, photography, film making etc. Speak to us and we may be able to support you.	A Reading Hack Volunteer needs to be able to present their idea clearly and have the commitment to seeing it through.

All Reading Hack Volunteers need to understand how to treat all people with equal respect and fairness.

• Please collect an application form from your local library, complete this and return it for the attention of the Library Manger.

What happens next?

- Either the Library Manager or the Volunteer Development Officer will be in touch with you.
- •You will be invited for an informal interview which will help you and we decide whether the volunteer role you are interested in is suitable for you and the library you have applied to.
- •If you are 13 17 years old and you are offered the volunteering placement, your consenting parent / guardian will be contacted to gain your emergency information which will help us to keep you safe.

Time commitment required of a Reading Hack Volunteer

• The time a volunteer can commit to the volunteering placement will depend on the volunteer as the individual and the area they are interested in volunteering in; therefore this will be discussed with you at the interview stage.
