

## Meet Lizzy Lizard



You will need:

- ❖ Two small (6) egg boxes or one large (12) box
- ❖ Small piece of coloured paper
- ❖ Pencil
- ❖ Glue
- ❖ Scissors
- ❖ Googly eyes or eye stickers (optional)
- ❖ Paint (optional)



Cut out the pointed, centre part of each egg box.



Next, cut out each individual eggcup – this should give you 12.

Trim all the eggcups to the same height, tidy up the sides, then put 2 eggcups to one side until later.



From the remaining 10, take one eggcup and put some glue inside the edge of the cup. Then place a second eggcup inside the first.

Repeat with the remaining 8 eggcups.



Take one of the eggcups you put to one side earlier and cut a horizontal line in the centre to form a mouth. This will be the lizard's head.



# Spring Fun from Bedford Borough Libraries

Cut a thin strip of coloured paper and make a fork at one end. This will make the lizard's tongue.



Glue the flat end of the tongue to the inside of the head through the horizontal slit, with the long forked end sticking out.

Glue the lizard body section to the inside of the head section.




Take the last remaining eggcup and cut out the centre.

Insert one of the pointed pieces you cut out in the first step through the hole you've just made.




Make the lizard's tail by gluing the remaining pointed pieces onto the ends of each other.



# Spring Fun from Bedford Borough Libraries

Glue the tail to the main body by pushing it into the open end of the body.



Using the egg box lid, draw and cut out some feet.

Glue the feet to the bottom of the lizard's body.




Draw some eyes, cut out and stick on to the lizard's head or use googly eyes or stickers if you have any.

Use a pencil to gently curl the lizard's tongue.



Leave your lizard to stand a while until all the glue is dry.
